

# Tips for Visiting Residents

### At Bethesda we encourage family and friends to visit our residents!

### General:

- Visiting can be very pleasant and enjoyable for family, friends and residents. Plan ahead and enjoy the wonderful relationship you have always enjoyed.
- Knock before entering a resident's room. Remember you are entering someone's home.
- Identify yourself each time you visit and sit for best visual and hearing potential.
- Be patient. Give residents the time they need to express themselves.

### Things to Remember:

- Talk! Residents need the attention and stimulation.
- Use picture books, photos from your electronic device, or a personalized memory book with labels/names on photos. A church directory and church bulletins work great for an active member of the congregation to catch up on fellow parishioners.
- Touch is important. A hug, back rub, or holding hands feels great anytime!
- Validate a resident's feelings. If a resident says his or her mother was in to visit, don't disagree, even if the person's mom couldn't have visited because she has been dead for 20 years. Just reaffirm the resident in the timeframe that he or she is in and say something like, "That was nice. I hope you enjoyed your visit."
- Hearing is the last sense to go, so avoid talking about a resident in front of them, because he or she can hear you!
- Visiting someone regardless of their condition is always meaningful!
- Bring a treat if you've checked with the nurse for any dietary restrictions in advance.
- Music therapy works! Sing hymns, songs from their era, or bring music you think they would enjoy.
- Bring children to visit. Maybe the children could make a picture for the wall to bring and present or read a story or book for a resident.
- Bring a pet to visit. (Note: Make sure to get permission from the facility and be sure that the pet is leashed, has updated vaccinations, and is clean and well behaved.)
- Come and eat dinner with a resident. For a nominal fee you can enjoy a wonderful meal together! (Please call 24 hours in advance to make your reservation.)
- Make or bring in a favorite meal to share. (Please call 24 hours in advance to reserve a lounge area for guests.)
- Read the newspaper, other reading materials or help the resident write letters.
- Share stories and reminisce.

#### Precautions:

- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer upon entering the facility and when leaving.
- Do not take a resident to the bathroom or transfer a resident from the bed to a chair. Press the call light if assistance is needed.
- Report any issues, concerns or unusual behaviors to the nurse.

Often, the fact that someone cares enough to visit is all that is needed from a resident's point of view.
