# 10 Tips for Family Caregivers

- I. Seek support from friends, family and other caregivers. You are not alone!

- 4. Learn how to communicate effectively with doctors and others.
- 5. Caregiving is hard work so take respite breaks often.
- 6. Watch out for signs of stress and/or depression and don't delay getting professional help when you need it.
- 7. Be open to new technologies that can help you care for your loved one.
- 8. Organize medical information so it's up to date and easy to find.
- 9. Make sure legal documents are in order.
- 10. Give yourself credit for doing the best you can in one of the toughest jobs there is!

Bethesda's new Therapy Center has state of the art equipment, exceptional staff and serves individuals from all of our programs. Connie Otterstetter, Director of Therapy/MDS Coordinator shared that, "At the Therapy Center, our goal is to assist residents to attain and maintain the highest level of function possible."

"The Solo-Step has been a valuable tool in building confidence while maintaining a safe environment as residents progress toward their goals."



The Solo-Step Track System consists of a high-performance, overhead aluminum track and trolley mounted to the ceiling. An attached harness protects patients from falling, which helps instill confidence.

When used in patient rehabilitation, the Solo-Step® Track System:

- Increases Patient and Therapist Safety
- Increases Productivity with a 1:1 Patient/Therapist Ratio
- Improves Patient Recovery Times



The new Therapy Center, Solo-Step and Warm Water Therapy Pool are great facilities to help residents function better and feel better. Connie concluded, "We strive to create a positive and encouraging environment where our residents feel comfortable and look forward to coming to see us each day."

# **Bethesda's In-Home Community Services**







Bethesda offers comprehensive care for people, right in their homes. Personal care, transportation services, companionship, housekeeping, meal preparation, and nursing care are just a few of the many services that are available.

Lola Dixon has received in-home services since 2009 and shared the following message:

"The In-Home services provided by Bethesda Adult Services is a blessing. The staff attempts to respond to whatever the need is."

"In my case I must use a walker for every step. Among the services I need are grocery shopping, laundry, bed making, opening containers and pill bottles, etc. The CNA who comes to my house twice a week for 2 or 3 hours at a time, is also my driver as I live in the country and need someone to do the driving. She safely helps me in and out of the house, in and out of the car, and in and out of wherever I need to go. She is a help on doctor visits with helpful questions and suggestions."

"We first needed in-home care when my husband became terminally ill. As his health continued to deteriorate he needed more physical help than I could give. Between hospice and Bethesda In-Home Care, he was able to stay at home."

"As I continue to age I expect I will need more help. It is a comfort to know it is available. I do know that I could not be living in my home now if it were not for the services offered by Bethesda In-Home Community Services. I am deeply grateful."

Bethesda In-Home Community Services Director, Deb Rice shared that the program is presently providing services to 29 people in the Aberdeen area. The program employs five staff members. Sylvia Davis is a trained CNA and Certified Med Aide, she provides services to Lola Dixon and many other clients in our community. When asked about the program and the people she serves, Sylvia said, "The best part of working in-home healthcare is that the people that you take care of become part of the family."
